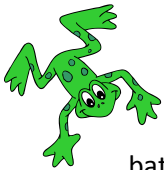

1/2 cup butter or margarine	1/2 cup powdered sugar
1/2 cup granulated sugar	1/2 tsp. cream of tartar
1 egg	1/2 tsp. baking soda
1/2 cup applesauce	2 cups flour

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Cream butter and sugar. Add remaining ingredients. Drop by small spoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake for 7 minutes.
