- 1. What is grace?
 - Gods Redemption At Christ's Expense
 - The Undeserved Love of God
- 2. What does faith do?

Faith connects a person to the work of Christ (His blood for my sins, His perfection as my righteousness.)

- 3. How does one obtain faith?
 - By the power of the <u>Holy Spirit</u> through the hearing of the <u>Word of God</u>.
- 4. What should be the <u>result</u> of having saving faith? Good works (which are a demonstration of having saving faith).
- What is <u>righteousness</u>?
 Being in a right relationship with God.
- 6. Who has obtained the righteousness of Christ?
 All who believe in Jesus as their Savior from sin.
- Why can't we save ourselves?
 All have sinned and have fallen short of the glory of God.

- 8. What is *justification*?
 - Declared "not guilty"
 - Just-as-if I had never sinned.
- 9. How much does justification cost...
 - a....you? Nothing—God's justification is free.
 - b....Christ? It cost Him his life.
- 10. What two things did Jesus do for you?
 - a. He lived perfectly in my place righteousness.
 - b. He died, shedding His blood for the forgiveness of all my sins.
- 11. What is the message of forgiveness called? **The Gospel**
- 12. What is faith?

Being enlightened by the Holy Spirit to the saving knowledge of Jesus as my Savior, so that I trust, rejoice, and find comfort in Him.

- 13. Why is the teaching of "Justification By Grace Through Faith" so important?
 - a. It is the central teaching of Scripture
 - b. It is the only way a person can be saved.

- What is "Sanctification?"
 Being made holy...
 <u>Wide Sense</u> the whole work of the Holy Spirit, bringing me to faith, and enabling us to lead godly

Narrow Sense – That part of the work of the Holy Spirit by which He directs and empowers the believer to lead a godly life.
