READINGS FROM HOLY SCRIPTURE

FIRST READING ~ Isaiah 44:21-28

- ²¹ Remember these things, O Jacob, and Israel, for you are my servant; I formed you; you are my servant; O Israel, you will not be forgotten by me. ²² I have blotted out your transgressions like a cloud and your sins like mist; return to me, for I have redeemed you.
- ²³ Sing, O heavens, for the LORD has done it; shout, O depths of the earth; break forth into singing, O mountains, O forest, and every tree in it! For the LORD has redeemed Jacob, and will be glorified in Israel.
- ²⁴ Thus says the LORD, your Redeemer, who formed you from the womb: "I am the LORD, who made all things, who alone stretched out the heavens, who spread out the earth by myself, ²⁵ who frustrates the signs of liars and makes fools of diviners, who turns wise men back and makes their knowledge foolish, ²⁶ who confirms the word of his servant and fulfills the counsel of his messengers, who says of Jerusalem, 'She shall be inhabited,' and of the cities of Judah, 'They shall be built, and I will raise up their ruins'; ²⁷ who says to the deep, 'Be dry; I will dry up your rivers'; ²⁸ who says of Cyrus, 'He is my shepherd, and he shall fulfill all my purpose'; saying of Jerusalem, 'She shall be built,' and of the temple, 'Your foundation shall be laid.""

SECOND READING ~ *John 8:31-36*

- ³¹ So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, ³² and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." ³³ They answered him, "We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, 'You will become free'?"
- ³⁴ Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin. ³⁵ The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever. ³⁶ So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

THE PASSION OF OUR LORD According to St. Mark – Part 1: Mark 14:1-25

Evangelist: It was now two days before the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened

Bread. And the chief priests and the scribes were seeking how to arrest

him by stealth and kill him, for they said,

CHORUS: "Not during the feast, lest there be an uproar from the people."

Evangelist: And while he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he was

reclining at table, a woman came with an alabaster flask of ointment of pure nard, very costly, and she broke the flask and poured it over his

head. There were some who said to themselves indignantly,

CHORUS: "Why was the ointment wasted like that? For this ointment could

have been sold for more than three hundred denarii and given to the

poor."

Evangelist: And they scolded her. But Jesus said,

CHRIST: "Leave her alone. Why do you trouble her? She has done a beautiful

thing to me. For you always have the poor with you, and whenever you want, you can do good for them. But you will not always have me. She has done what she could; she has anointed my body beforehand for burial. And truly, I say to you, wherever the gospel is proclaimed in the

whole world, what she has done will be told in memory of her."

Evangelist: Then Judas Iscariot, who was one of the twelve, went to the chief priests

in order to betray him to them. And when they heard it, they were glad and promised to give him money. And he sought an opportunity to betray him. And on the first day of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the

Passover lamb, his disciples said to him,

CHORUS: "Where will you have us go and prepare for you to eat the

Passover?"

Evangelist: And he sent two of his disciples and said to them,

CHRIST: "Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow

him, and wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' And he will show you a large upper room furnished

and ready; there prepare for us."

Evangelist: And the disciples set out and went to the city and found it just as he had

told them, and they prepared the Passover. And when it was evening, he came with the twelve. And as they were reclining at table and eating,

Jesus said,

CHRIST: "Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me, one who is eating with me."

Evangelist: They began to be sorrowful and to say to him one after another,

CHORUS: "Is it I?"

Evangelist: He said to them,

CHRIST: "It is one of the twelve, one who is dipping bread into the dish with me.

For the Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man

if he had not been born."

Evangelist: And as they were eating, he took bread, and after blessing it broke it and

gave it to them, and said,

CHRIST: "Take; this is my body."

Evangelist: And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, and

they all drank of it. And he said to them,

CHRIST: "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly, I

say to you, I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when

I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

In many and various ways, God spoke to His people of old by the prophets.

But now in these last days, He has spoken to us by His Son. Hebrews 1:1-2a
