
# **EPISTLE** ~ 1 Thessalonians 3:9–13

Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" <sup>39</sup> And some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples." <sup>40</sup> He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out."







and lead us not into temptation,




# **Collect of the Day**

- C Amen.


#### **Collect for Peace**
