

OLD TESTAMENT Isaiah 48:17–22

P A reading from Isaiah, chapter 48.

¹⁷Thus says the LORD, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel: "I am the LORD your God, who teaches you to profit, who leads you in the way you should go. ¹⁸Oh that you had paid attention to My commandments! Then your peace would have been like a river, and your righteousness like the waves of the sea; ¹⁹your offspring would have been like the sand, and your descendants like its grains; their name would never be cut off or destroyed from before Me." ²⁰Go out from Babylon, flee from Chaldea, declare this with a shout of joy, proclaim it, send it out to the end of the earth; say, "The LORD has redeemed His servant Jacob!" ²¹They did not thirst when He led them through the deserts; He made water flow for them from the rock; He split the rock and the water gushed out. ²²"There is no peace," says the LORD, "for the wicked."

The Passion of Our Lord According to St. Luke - Part 4: Luke 23:1-25

Evangelist: Then the whole company of them arose and brought him before Pilate. And

they began to accuse him, saying,

CHORUS: "We found this man misleading our nation and forbidding us to give

tribute to Caesar, and saying that he himself is Christ, a king."

Evangelist: And Pilate asked him,

CHORUS: "Are you the King of the Jews?"

Evangelist: And he answered him, CHRIST: "You have said so."

Evangelist: Then Pilate said to the chief priests and the crowds,

CHORUS: "I find no guilt in this man."

Evangelist: But they were urgent, saying,

CHORUS: "He stirs up the people, teaching throughout all Judea, from Galilee even

to this place."

Evangelist: When Pilate heard this, he asked whether the man was a Galilean. And when

he learned that he belonged to Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him over to Herod, who was himself in Jerusalem at that time. When Herod saw Jesus, he was very glad, for he had long desired to see him, because he had heard about him, and he was hoping to see some sign done by him. So he questioned him at some length, but he made no answer. The chief priests and the scribes stood by, vehemently accusing him. And Herod with his soldiers treated him with contempt and mocked him. Then, arraying him in splendid clothing, he

sent him back to Pilate. And Herod and Pilate became friends with each other that very day, for before this they had been at enmity with each other. Pilate then called together the chief priests and the rulers and the people, and said

to them,

CHORUS: "You brought me this man as one who was misleading the people. And

after examining him before you, behold, I did not find this man guilty of any of your charges against him. Neither did Herod, for he sent him back to us. Look, nothing deserving death has been done by him. I will

therefore punish and release him."

Evangelist: But they all cried out together,

CHORUS: "Away with this man, and release to us Barabbas"—

Evangelist: — a man who had been thrown into prison for an insurrection started in the

city and for murder. Pilate addressed them once more, desiring to release

Jesus, but they kept shouting,

CHORUS: "Crucify, crucify him!"

Evangelist: A third time he said to them,

CHORUS: "Why, what evil has he done? I have found in him no guilt deserving

death. I will therefore punish and release him."

Evangelist: But they were urgent, demanding with loud cries that he should be crucified.

And their voices prevailed. So Pilate decided that their demand should be

granted. He released the man who had been thrown into prison for insurrection and murder, for whom they asked, but he delivered Jesus over to their will.




Taught by our Lord and trusting His promises, we are bold to pray:
