REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM

- In Holy Baptism Judy Krause was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all her sin. St. Paul says, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?"

and the life + everlasting. Amen.






SERMON ~ "He Lives, He Loves!"

Matthew 22:29-33


