"Disciple John"
Matthew 10:2–4; John 13:21–25; John 19:25–27; John 20:1–10

Our theme this week is on love. We show love in all times of the year. As we continue our discussion of Jesus' 12 disciples, we will meet the disciple of love: Disciple John.

We have heard John's name mentioned several times the past weeks. John was one of the first four fisherman called to be disciples. John was the brother of James, one of the sons of Zebedee. Along with Peter and James, John was one of the small group of three disciples who were with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane and at His transfiguration.

While Jesus loved all His disciples, He had a special relationship with Disciple John. John is called, "the disciple whom Jesus loved" (e.g., John 21:7). Like all of the disciples and us, John was a sinner. Along with his brother James, John was called one of the "Sons of Thunder" (Mark 3:17). John may have had a thunderous, quick-tempered personality. John's mother selfishly wanted her son to have a special place in Jesus' kingdom.

Jesus loved John and all of His disciples enough to die on the cross for their sins. John is the inspired Gospel writer who tells us that "God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). From the cross, Jesus lovingly asks John to care for His mother, Mary, and asks Mary to treat John as her son.

John not only saw the love of Jesus from beneath His cross. John also was one of the disciples who went to Jesus' tomb on Easter Sunday morning and saw it was empty. Along with the other disciples, John saw his resurrected Savior and Friend. After the Pentecost, John went with Disciple Peter to the streets of Jerusalem and boldly shared that Jesus was alive. Jesus' love was for everyone.

John, who saw the love of Jesus from the cross, told about that love in his missionary travels. John wrote about Jesus' love to the early churches. In the last book of the Bible, Revelation, John described what it will be like to be with the loving, victorious Jesus when He comes again on the Last Day.

Many people think about love occasionally — on Valentines' Day and other special occasions. We celebrate that Jesus loves us every day, and as Jesus' disciples, we have the privilege of loving others in His name for life.

Jesus, You loved Disciple John and You loved us enough to suffer and die for us. Because of Your love, we are called to love others. Bless us as we live and share Your love in school, at home, with our friends and even with our enemies, so that others will come to love You and follow as Your disciples. Amen.
