


Wednesday Divine Services are at 6:30 pm. The service is a repeat of the prior weekend Service.

Catechetical Comments

A Series

THE APOSTLES' CREED

This month we continue our look at The Apostles' Creed and consider the following question: *Who is God?*

93. Who is God?

In His Word God has told us that He is

E. all-knowing (omniscient)

The *Small Catechism* continues its answer to the question *Who Is God?* by saying:

In His Word God has told us that He is

E. all-knowing (omniscient)

It then offers the following Scripture passages in support of this answer:

Ps. 139:1-4 – O LORD, You have searched me and known me! You know when I sit down and when I rise up; You discern my thoughts from afar. You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, behold, O LORD, You know it altogether.

John 21:17 – Lord, You know everything.

What does it mean to say that God knows everything? Just that. He *knows* everything. Any arena of human knowledge He knows. Science, mathematics, architecture, geology, zoology, anthropology, astronomy, art, music, language. He knows all of history. He knows all that is happening now. He knows everything that will happen in the future. He knows what people are thinking. He knows everything they're feeling. He knows what they're doing now and everything they will do. He knows it all. He knows *everything*.

That's just some of what it means to say that God is *omniscient*, that He knows everything. But what does it *not* mean?

It does not mean that He *controls* everything. That's a different attribute and we do not want to commingle or confuse God's attributes.

Some might suggest that, since God knows what's going to happen, He is somehow responsible for it happening. This is often said in respect to whether or not someone is a believer. They will say, "Since God knows whether or not a person will believe in Him, it must be that He decided that such a person would not believe in Him and, therefore, that makes Him responsible."

This is a confusion of God's attributes. God's foreknowledge as to whether a person will or will not be a believer does not mean that He has made that determination, which would be an exercise of His *omnipotence*, not His *omniscience*.

By the same token, people will blame God for allowing someone to enter a school with an AK47 and start shooting children. Did God know this would happen? Yes. Did He cause it to happen? No.

It may go without saying, but God knows an awful lot of things we don't. Blaming Him for things that we don't understand is an act of unbelief. Rather, we should recognize that He knows everything and we don't.

What good can there be to a school shooting? I don't know. But I trust that He does. Romans 8:28 is still in effect.

Hostility toward those who hold to the truth of the Scriptures may continue and even increase, bringing a time of testing and persecution. Perhaps our congregation will experience other kinds of sorrows. We just don't know.

But there is one thing we do know, one thing we can count on, one thing we know will never change, and that is the love and mercy of our God and Savior. His Word will be proclaimed, even if there are many who reject it. His Sacraments will continue to be given, cleansing, feeding, and strengthening His flock. And His Church will go on, for the gates of hell cannot stand against it. Those are promises we can cling to and rely on, no matter what the future holds.

We rejoice in those promises, as sure and true for us as Jesus' empty tomb. He lives, and so will we. And in a world and life where not much is certain, how good to have a foundation that cannot be shaken. So this we know: *In ten years* . . . we will be with Jesus, either here in time or there in eternity.

Two opportunities for financial aid/scholarships for church worker students.

South Wisconsin District Financial Aid applications are due May 15. Anyone attending a Concordia University or Seminary, is a member of an LCMS congregation in the SWD and is preparing to be a full-time church worker (pastor, teacher, deaconess, DCE/DCO, DFLM, DPM, lay minister) is encouraged to apply. There are two applications required (District Financial Aid Application and Personal Aid Application). Both are available on the SWD website – swd.lcms.org/resources/student-aid-applications/.

LWML Female Church Worker Scholarship

The LWML South Wisconsin District has been blessed to be able to award scholarships each year since 1991 to women from South Wisconsin District who are preparing for church work in the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. An endowment was established to assist women with their undergraduate education. The number and amount of scholarships varies from year to year depending on the funds available that year. Applications are currently being accepted for the 2023-2024 school year.

Who may apply? Active female members of congregations of the South Wisconsin District of the LCMS who are residents of the SWD prior to college and are preparing for "full-time service in the LCMS" are encouraged to apply. An applicant must be enrolled as an undergraduate at one of the educational institutions of the Synod for the 2023-2024 school year. (Full-time service is defined as any position available through the Board of Assignments of the Synod.)

How to apply? Complete the LWML scholarship application forms and return them to the LWML SWD Scholarship Committee. All applications and references <u>must be postmarked no later than April 30, 2023.</u> Application instructions and forms are available online at http://www.lwml-swd.org/scholarships, scroll to the bottom.

"Stories of Stewardship" by Reverend Paul Alliet

From Pastor's words, we see that, although we frequently think about stewardship as a "thing", it is really a learned way of life that we continue to grow in during our lifetimes. And, that growth is accomplished only through the Holy Spirit acting in and through Word and Sacraments. AND, with that as a backdrop, we will still bear fruit in our old age! Praise God!





Stroke is an Emergency!

'B.E.F.A.S.T.' When You Suspect a Stroke

When it comes to stroke, seconds, minutes, and hours matter. If you suspect a stroke, it's important to call 911 right away. The faster teams can administer care and treatment, the better the outcomes. Acting quickly is of critical importance after a stroke is suspected. Knowing the time a symptom started, or the time when you last felt well, will have an impact on what treatments can be offered safely.



To Prevent a Stroke:

- If you have high blood pressure-work towards the blood pressure your doctor recommends as your goal. High blood pressure is the biggest contributor to the risk of stroke.
- Maintain a healthy weight. Obesity and its complications raise your odds of having a stroke.
- Exercise at a moderate intensity five days a week.
- If you drink-do it in moderation.
- If you have atrial fibrillation-treat it. This irregular heartbeat causes blood clots to form in the heart. The clots can travel to the brain, causing a stroke.
- If you have diabetes-control it. Monitor your blood sugar, use diet, exercise, and medicines to help keep your blood sugar within the recommended range.
- If you smoke-quit. Ask your doctor about the many quit-smoking aids available.
