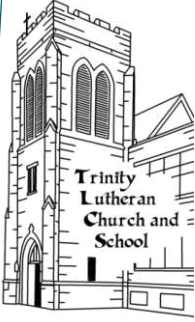

Catechetical Comments

A Series

THE APOSTLES' CREED

This month we continue our look at The Apostles' Creed and consider the First Article.

What is the First Article?

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

In the *Small Catechism*, Martin Luther explains the First Article of the Creed, as he does with all the articles, by asking the question:

What does this mean?

He then answers the question thusly:

I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them.

He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.

He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil.

All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.

This is most certainly true.

Dr. Luther begins his explanation with the very basics of what God has given us in our creation: body, soul, eyes, ears, every part of us, as well as our reasoning ability, and our senses. Essentially, everything we are He has

given us. This would include our gifts, talents, and abilities of every kind. Are you artistic, athletic, or intellectual? Are you gifted at mathematics, science, language arts, fine arts, performing arts, or social sciences? Are you tall, short, thin, heavy, blonde, brunette, dark skinned or light skinned? Everything you are, God has made you, despite how our lunatic culture rebels against this. God is your creator, not you. And God does not make mistakes.

Luther adds to his explanation that God still takes care of you and everything He has made you.

How does He do this? He provides clothing, shoes, food, housing, family, property, and all other material goods. Everything you need to support your life here on earth, God provides.

His means of provision change over time. When you're a child, God provides for you by the agency of parents or other guardians. When you're older, He provides for you by giving you opportunities to exercise the gifts, talents, and abilities He's given you in order to earn a living and make your way in the world.

Why does He do this? Only out of fatherly, divine, goodness and mercy. You haven't earned it. He doesn't give all this to you because you deserve it. In fact, you don't. But He gives it anyway.

How are you to respond to all His giving? With thanks, praise, service, and obedience. There's no better response than gratitude. And why not? He certainly deserves it.

This is most certainly true. ✠

Ascension Day & Worship Service



Ascension Day is an important Christian holiday that marks the conclusion of the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ and his ascension into heaven. Observed 40 days after Easter Sunday, Ascension Day commemorates the moment when Jesus, after his resurrection, ascended into the clouds before the eyes of his Disciples. Various Christian denominations around the world recognize this event, each with unique customs and traditions.

According to the New Testament, Jesus appeared to his Disciples several times over 40 days after his resurrection, teaching them about the Kingdom of God. On the 40th day, Jesus led his Disciples to the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem, where he blessed them before rising to the heavens. The Acts of the Apostles (Acts 1:9-11) and the Gospel of Luke (Luke 24:50-53) detail this event, emphasizing the importance of Jesus' ascension and the promise of His return.

The ascension of Jesus serves as a symbol of hope and assurance for Christians, as it signifies the completion of Jesus' earthly mission and the beginning of His heavenly reign. It also symbolizes the promise of eternal life and the bestowal of the Holy Spirit upon the Disciples during the subsequent event of Pentecost.
