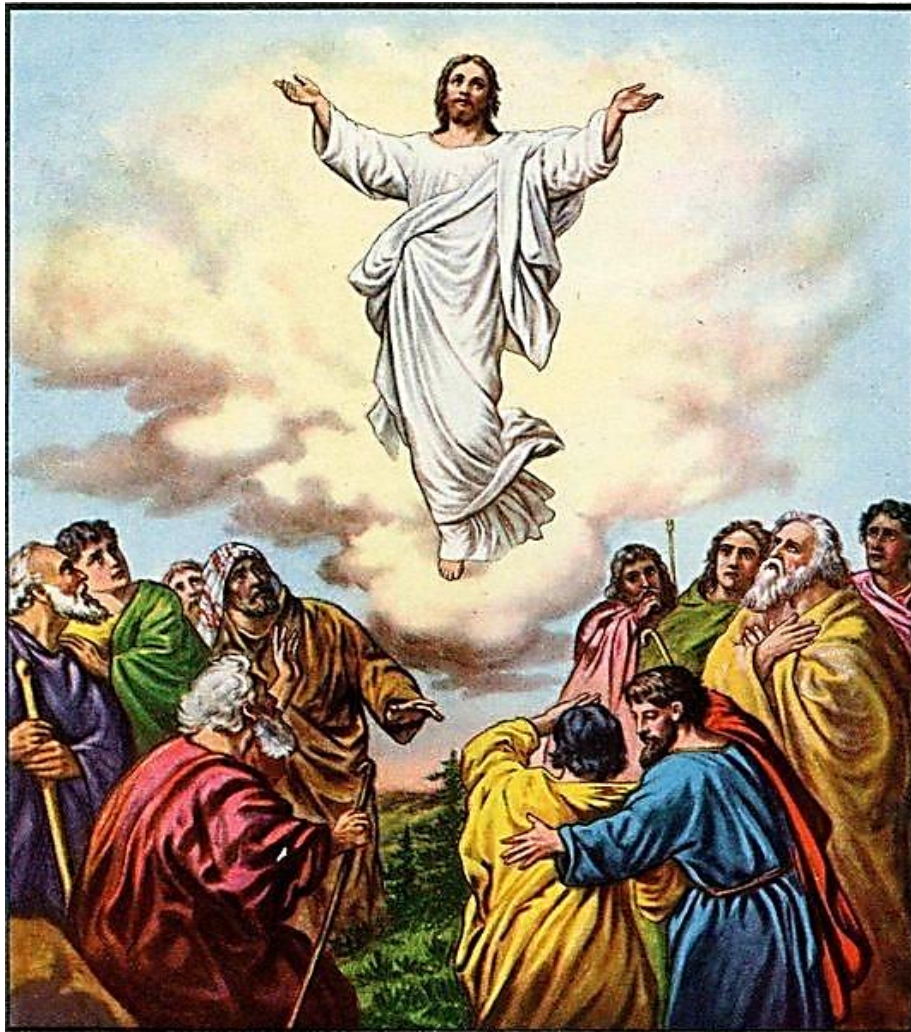
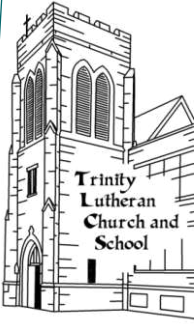

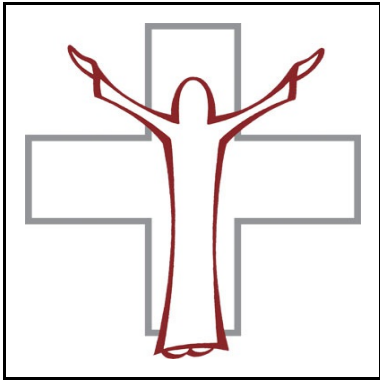

# Death and Burial

This month I would like to give voice to some concerns that have been weighing on me for some time regarding the developing attitudes of many Christians on the issue of funerals and burial. Much of the secular worldview seems to be invading the hearts and minds of God's people. I would like to address some of these matters in this article.

## 1 – Funeral or No Funeral?

Many people today say that they don't want to have a church funeral. "I don't want anyone to make a fuss," some say. "I'm a private person," one dying woman said to me. This kind of thinking is decidedly wrong-headed.

A church funeral is not about "making a fuss." It's not, technically speaking, principally about the deceased person. It's about rejoicing in the life of faith which Christ lived out in that person's day-to-day living. It's also about serving the family of the one who has died, by reassuring them of the promise of the resurrection for those who have died in the Faith. There is no better comfort for those suffering the loss of a loved one than to hear the tender words of Christ, "He who believes in Me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in Me will never die" (John 11:26). When considering this question, I urge you to think of your loved ones and do not deprive them of the peace God intends for them to have at the end of your life.

## 2 – Funeral Service at the Church or the Funeral Home?

Just as the words of Christ are important to hear at the time of loss, so too is the context in which they are heard. A funeral is a worship service, praising God for the assurance given us in the death and resurrection of Jesus. Since Jesus is the focus – not the deceased person – the best context for the service praising Him is the church. There, surrounded by the reminders both of the faith in which the person lived and the house of God in which they worshiped their Savior, God gives a peace that cannot be given in a place as sterile as most funeral homes. Funeral homes are not

houses of worship. Your church is. Please bear that in mind.

## 3 – To Cremate or Not to Cremate

It is becoming increasingly common for Christians to choose cremation over burial. There are several problems with this.

While not expressly forbidden in Scripture, it must be known that burial has, until relatively recent times, been the normal practice of the church. Cremation, on the other hand, stems from paganism. A Christian would do well to ask, "Why would I, as a Christian, want my body to be treated like an unbeliever?"

I gather that some, if not most, of the motivation for this comes down to cost; it is typically cheaper to be cremated as opposed to being buried. But doesn't it sound crass to say, "We're giving Mom the cheapest disposition we can find?" Maybe Mom is okay with that, but should she be?

There is also a popular misconception about the process of cremation. Most people think that the body is simply burned and what remains are ashes. This is not true. Bones don't burn so easily, so they are then pulverized (ground up) into ashes.

What I hope you will consider is this: As a Christian, your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 6:19). Shouldn't such a temple be treated with loving care, even after your soul has departed? It may no longer be His temple, but it once was. Is burning it and grinding it up the most respectful treatment? I can't say that it is. Can you? Please consider this when making your funeral plans. †

Dear friends of the Pipe Organ;

You may have heard we are having a few issues with our beautiful Moller organ. The Gedacht bass pouches have reached a time of re-leathering. Age has caused hardening and possible micro holes which may cause different response times or incomplete pouch movement.



Our Organist(s) have been able to keep these problems from disrupting our worship. We are working to schedule a complete inspection and arrange repairs. As you can guess, there are not too many people qualified to work on a vintage instrument such as our Moller. Wahl Organ Builders have been caring for us since the rebuild and have recommended another pipe organ builder who may be able to help us in a more timely fashion than he is able to.

Thank you to all who have contributed and continue to contribute to the care of our wonderful pipe organ. Your generosity is greatly appreciated by the Board of Worship and the congregation. Without you we would not be able to pursue the repairs without a lot of worry about how to pay for them.
